### Race/Ethnicity Description Definitions

**Hispanic/Latino:** A person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.

**American Indian or Alaskan Native:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of North and South America (including Central America) and who maintains a tribal affiliation or community attachment.

**Asian:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

**Black or African American:** A person having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.

**Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Hawaii, Guam, Samoa, or other Pacific Islands.

**White:** A person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.

### Admissions Procedures

You should complete the admissions process well in advance of the expected quarter starting date, since enrollment is limited in certain programs.

The Compass Exam must be completed, unless you have applicable transfer credit or acceptable SAT, ACT, or CPE scores. The Compass Exam is administered daily.

If you have a disability which may affect your admissions test exam scores or the successful completion of your program of study, you should contact the Admissions Office prior to taking the exam or registering for courses.

Many programs require a high school diploma or its equivalent (GED) before enrollment. Check with the Admissions Office on the requirements of your program of study.

### Financial Aid

Financial assistance is available to qualified students from a variety of federal, state, and local sources. Students at Middle Georgia Technical College can look to several areas for financial aid: Pell Grant, HOPE Grant, HOPE Scholarship, Workforce Investment Act, and local scholarships.

To be eligible for financial aid, a student must apply for admission, be accepted into an approved program of study, and have a high school diploma or equivalent (GED) or pass an independently administered test to establish ability to benefit from the program of study.
